内容:	The Model United Nations project prepares students for participation in the Japan University English Model United Nations (JUEMUN) conference, and allows students to develop presentation, discussion, and negotiation tactics in English while deepening their understanding of one of the most important institutions in the world. At the same time, we will research and learn about issues that are important to countries on every continent. The JUEMUN conference provides students with an opportunity to research, write about, and discuss global issues in depth, from the perspective of countries outside of Japan.		
到達目標:	The overall aim of this course is to develop a deeper understanding of the United Nations and how it operates, as well as in depth discussion of a global issue that is relevant to the world at large. Upon completion of this course, students will demonstrate the ability to: (1) synthesize information from a variety of sources into a position paper, (2) analyze and discuss a global issue from the perspective of other countries, (3) prepare and deliver presentations on a global issue from the perspective of another country, and (4) participate in an international MUN (or mock event) where they will deliver their findings to a group of international peers.		
講義方法:	Background information will be introduced through a combination of the following: (1) short lecture or documentary, (2) critical reading assignment, (3) group discussion, (4) case study, and (5) problem-based activity. Fieldwork will include inter-collegiate practice and/or attendance at an MUN event. The end product will be a report and presentation that will be delivered to peers and other interested individuals. Classes will utilize a mixture of (1) guided research on a global issue, (2) discussion of the global issue from alternative perspectives, (3) collaboration on how best to discuss, debate, and negotiate, and (4) guided practice on MUN parliamentary procedure		
準備学習:	Students should have a fairly high level of English reading, writing and conversational ability. Basic computer skills are also necessary.		
成績評価:	Evaluation will be based on: Classroom Participation (20%), Position Paper (30%), Conference Participation (30%), and Post-conference Reflection Paper (20%).
